

Fort Hall



When Ft. Hall was completed in 1834, it stood as the only American outpost in the entire Oregon country.

Fort Hall was as a supply center for fur traders and Native Americans. It was a welcome supply stop for westbound emigrants.

The Fort is near the entrance of Portneuf into Snake River. The fort was a stockade 80 ft. square built of Cottonwood trees set on end sunk 2½ feet in the ground and standing about 15 feet above with two bastions 8 ft. square at the opposite angles.



The fort continued in operation until 1856.
